Community Education Programs The CMLC offers a plethora of programs and services for all of the Corvallis community throughout the year. These include but are not limited to: language learning, multi-age art classes, pathways to citizenship and legal residency, heritage practice, cooking, and more! We operate on a sliding scale to ensure that everyone has access to these programs.



\$19,460

Pathway to Legal Residency Services We offer free citizenship and naturalization support including help understanding the application for naturalization, tutoring for the naturalization civics test and more. Overall we have helped 70+ people get citizenship. We also help people find pathways for legal residency as well. This year we have served 106 people from 23 different countries.

In addition to our many services, the CMLC also awards financial aid to those undertaking the process of getting their citizenship or for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals recipients. In the 22-23 year we awarded 5 DACA Scholarships and 3 naturalization processing fee loans.




ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNING

Our most developed courses are our English classes. Those who wish to enroll must first take a placement exam. This is to ensure that everyone gets put into the appropriate level class. Classes are kept small so that students can maximize their learning. Currently we offer:

- Beginner English Class
- Advanced Beginner English Class
- Intermediate English Class

These courses are taught by our wonderful and highly qualified ESL teachers, who go above and beyond mere language instruction. They foster a warm and inclusive community among our students, where connections are formed and a sense of belonging thrives. This is further supplemented by our English conversation circles, where students get together to practice their English in a more casual and fun setting.



HEALTH AND SELF CARE

We strongly believe in the significance of holistic well-being for leading a fulfilled life. Particularly when adjusting to a new life in a different country, managing high levels of stress becomes crucial. To support individuals facing these challenges, we offer a variety of classes aimed at addressing these struggles. Our Manejando el Estrés class, taught in Spanish, provides valuable strategies for effectively managing stress and navigating through life's challenges. Similarly, our Mindfulness Meditation class offers techniques to promote relaxation and reduce stress. Additionally, we have introduced a Gratitude Yoga class as a gesture of appreciation for our hardworking community members.



EL SECRETO DE LA BAMBA

The legacy of "El Secreto de La Bamba" was revealed through the opportunity to find alternative means of expression; to learn, share, and celebrate the diverse multicultural identities of the Corvallis School District.

This joint effort focused on working with 5th grade students from Lincoln Elementary, offering 40 teaching hours over the course of five months, to learn about the meaning of action, space, force, time, pulse, shape and energy involved in "La Bamba." The CMLC partnered with Maestra María Ortiz, Elena Chavarría and Naomi Hartman to make this experience an unforgettable event for students and families, and to ignite a sense of wonder for further exploration and expression among participants. This *Son Jarocho*, the underlying musical genre, is a historic testimony of México's roots and history in the pursuit of racial justice.





EL SECRETO DE LA BAMBA

La Bamba, taught under its frame of World Cultural Heritage, was part of the Multicultural Festival, an event that involved all other Lincoln Elementary students in international performances, guided by the mentorship of culturally diverse teachers and parents.

El Secreto de La Bamba is that we all share the same rhythm that makes our hearts beat together.

MUNDUS IMAGINALIS

Nine children in Corvallis with a diverse ethnic background found each other at the CMLC. Sharing a vision of multicultural literacy, they participated in a 10-day-long art class called Mundus Imaginalis, an opportunity for collective expression through muralism. Children were enthusiastic when instructed to imagine a world that does not yet exist, and they could help create. The work of art they produced is entitled The Galaxy of Possibilities. Interestingly, they did not want to imagine a different world, rather, they wanted to see the uniqueness of ours within the vastness of the universe.

Through this journey, the young participants began operating in the psychological realm of the imaginal, a place connected to their subconscious that lies between the mind and the material world of matter. According to Jungian theory, Mundus Imaginalis is a real place of undeniable truth that can be entered through imagination.









The motivation behind this art class was to value a process of becoming (transformation) rather than being (conformation) and to move from individual towards collective artistic expression. Adding layer over layer of images and color, the constant evolution on the canvas sat a foundation for creating a visual representation of what they understand and imagine to be equality, self-determination, children's rights, and social justice.

The next stage of Mundus Imaginalis consists of a travelling exhibit where The Galaxy of Possibilities will ignite inspiration among other groups of children who in turn will create their own possibilities.
